KG	Read alouds, with discussion; games that involve letters and letter sounds	Games and activities involving counting and number recognition; games and activities that strengthen hand muscles.

4 th	Read books from 3 rd grade curriculum; <i>D'Aulaire's Greek Myths** (or attend Summer Enrichment Class in Aug); Story of the World Volume 1: Ancient Times by Susan Wise Bauer**</i>	+/- fact flashcards through 20, x/÷ fact flashcards through 9, and 100 facts in under 4 minutes by the end of 4th Grade
5 th	Read books from 4 th grade curriculum; <i>D'Aulaire's Greek Myths** (or attend Summer Enrichment Class in Aug); The Story of the World Volume 2: The Middle Ages by Susan Wise Bauer</i>	+/- fact flashcards through 20, x/÷ fact flashcards through 12, and 100 facts in under 3 minutes by the end of 5th Grade
6 th	Read books from 5 th grade curriculum; <i>D'Aulaire's Greek Myths** (or attend Summer Enrichment Class in Aug); The Story of the World Volume 3: Early Modern Times by Susan Wise Bauer</i>	+/- fact flashcards through 20, x/÷ fact flashcards through 12, and 100 facts in under 2 minutes by the end of 6th Grade
