

Directions for First Day of School and Opening Ceremony at Crescent Hill
Tuesday, August 28, 2018 8:00 AM

The start of the school year is a very special time for families, students, and faculty. Highlands Latin School likes to begin the year with a traditional ceremony that recognizes the importance of the school community. The Opening School Ceremony includes a student procession, followed by a brief, thirty-minute service in the sanctuary. **Students arrive between 7:30 and 7:45.**

Junior Kindergarten Students: proceed directly to their classroom. They do not participate in the Opening School Ceremony.

***IN Students:** Families are asked to arrive before 7:45 at the Crescent Hill campus. Please leave student backpacks in the car. Students will be dropped off in the Crescent Hill chapel (near the gym) and all students from IN will sit together accompanied by teachers. Parents please proceed to the sanctuary after drop off. Students will process into the ceremony with Crescent Hill students.*

After ceremony, IN students will be dismissed first. Parents, please join us on steps outside of the sanctuary and drive directly with your student to IN campus. Upon arrival at IN campus, we will assemble outside of entrance 2. When two teachers/staff have arrived, parents are dismissed. When all students and teachers have arrived, K goes in, then I, then 2.

CH K-8 Processional Directions: (arrive by 7:45AM)

1. Kindergarteners should be accompanied directly to their classrooms where teachers will greet and escort them to their places for the procession.
2. First and second graders will assemble in the Chapel (Chapel entrance is south of the Birchwood Lobby entrance) and be escorted to the Sanctuary by their teachers for the processional. Book bags and lunch boxes will be left in the chapel foyer. Signs will be posted on the lawn to direct you.
3. Students in grades 3-8 will assemble with their homeroom teachers and classes outside on the front and side lawns by 7:45 A.M. Flags will clearly indicate the location of each grade.
4. Sixth-eighth grade parents are asked to take book bags to the 2nd floor hallway. Third-fifth grade parents will put book bags in the Birchwood lobby. Signs will be posted to indicate the correct location.

All parents please assemble in the Sanctuary by 8:00 A.M. and await the HLS student procession.

Because the first day of school can be a bit stressful for the younger ones, we ask that parents drop their children off as quickly as possible and proceed to the sanctuary. A quick separation will also give teachers adequate time to prepare the students for the ceremony.

Parents of kindergarteners and students new to HLS: Please talk to your children about these plans. It is a busy, exciting morning and knowing what to expect is important. They should know

that they will wait and walk in with their classes. Once in the sanctuary, they should watch their teachers to know when to sit and stand.

Students will be dismissed to their classrooms for the first day of school after the brief opening ceremony. Students will be available for pick-up at 3:30 P.M.

Rain contingency: If it is raining at 7:30, students will go to these locations: 7th-8th will go to the cafeteria, 1st-6th to the gym, K to classrooms.

The Opening School Ceremony is meaningful for parents, students, and faculty alike. It conveys the importance we place on the pursuit of wisdom, knowledge, and virtue. We look forward to seeing you there!
